August has been a good month. I have two albums recorded and mixed....although, I planned to make some adjustments to some recordings. So, much of August was taken with 'adjusting' some recordings (deleting aspects I thought could be better, and improving certain things i.e. sounds and performance).

An average day in my life this past August has been the same as my past summers. I wake up 4.30 - 5.30am. I run for 20 minutes - shower, then in studio at 6.30 am. I record or write until 1.00pm, when I have lunch.....Then I step outside the door, onto a footpath (there's plenty on this farm) then I run again for half an hour. I also run on the farmland once the crops have been harvested. Then back into the Studio....I suppose it might sound boring to some, however, it's where I like to be, if not on stage.

I like eating out in the evenings...Indian and Italian my favourite food. That's it my friends xxx

#### **RUSS - LIFE STORIES**

Welcome Friends, to the show that never ends...It's called RB NEWS. Today we're starting in May 1964. The town is Margate....I think you'll agree it seems like we were living on another planet.

We started another summer season at Margate Winter Gardens. It was the same show as the year before, with the same Producer, Richard Stone, and the same Director, Bunny Baron, and mostly the same girl dancers.


This time there was no caravan accommodation but a large, detached bungalow which was situated a few miles away in Broadstairs. We didn't drive straight to Margate from home, it was thought a good idea by the management that, because Richard Stone also had a show starting at the same time at Southend on Sea and because we were along the same coast line, we should for publicity purposes, travel not by road but voyage by ship and sail the 30/40 miles, where the first cast would be met by a brass band, who would play 'Happy Days Are Here Again' as they disembark. The other show, by the way, starred one of the biggest TV celebrities of the day, Norman Vaughan. Norman was seen every week compering the biggest TV show, 'Sunday Night at The London Palladium'. He also appeared in a well known chocolate advert 'Roses grow on you'.

I can still hear the voices laughing as we climbed down the steps on to the ship. Norman Vaughan and Tel greeted each other warmly. They had appeared together many times on television. Tel introduced us to the ever smiling Norman and his family - he seemed just an ordinary man, like the average uncle.... Again this staged, publicity stunt was 'Old School' variety, and it seemed a million miles away from the swinging sixties, of which we were a part.

Well my friends, I'll continue the story of the voyage and The Margate Summer Season next month.....Have a great September...Love, Russ xxx


### **NEW MUSIC**

Trust of some interest.






#### **HOLEY MOLY – Not another one?**

Earlier this Summer, 22nd July to be precise, the Music World lost John Mayall, the "Godfather of the British Blues", and an Officer of the Order of the British Empire (OBE), as appointed in the Queen's 2005 Birthday Honours List. Mayall formed The Bluesbreakers in 1963, and the number of famous musicians that passed through the lifespan of that band would fill this newsletter on its own, but most notably they include guitarists Eric Clapton, Peter Green and Mick Taylor, bass players John McVie, Andy Fraser and Jack Bruce, drummers Mick Fleetwood, Jon Hiseman and Aynsley Dunbar. Admittedly, some of these names passed through the band that quickly, they probably got away with using a Short Stay Car Park.

The point of this piece is that John featured on keyboards and guitar, and over the years he owned a huge number of guitars, which by his own admission, he liked to knock about and decorate. He was once quoted in an interview (Guitarist magazine, October 2014) as saying, "I cut out the parts I don't need, tear out everything except one pickup and volume control, then whatever shape is left, I decorate it." He also claimed he only used one pick,

It was therefore very interesting that around 1979 / 1980, photographs appeared with him playing his very own "holey guitar". Now, I wonder where the inspiration for that design came from.





Unfortunately, Mayall's guitar collection was consumed in a house fire in 1979, so whether or not his holey guitar was reduced to ashes, we'll probably never know.

# **DAVE'S COVER QUEST**

Born on March 17, 1964, in Helsinki, Finland, **Leena Vanamo** started her career in the early 1980s and released her only album in 1984. **Me ainoastaan,** which I believe translates to **Only Us**, as you will hear, is a cover version of Russ Ballard's I **Wish Tonight Could Last Forever**, as originally recorded and released by Sweden's Agnetha Fältskog, the blonde chanteur from ABBA.

Taking an interest in music at a young age, **Leena Vanamo** learned to play piano and flute, attending the Sibelius Academy. At 12 years old, she made the brave move of approaching a record company, telling them she wanted to be a singer. Her audition was well received, but she was advised to wait a few years. Five years later she approached the same label and achieved the recording contract she had longed for.

Her initial recordings failed to achieve success, and Leena became a backing singer on the live circuit before entering a TV talent competition. Despite not winning, she was signed to CBS Records and released **Sua Kaipaan**, an album of cover versions performed in Finnish. These included the **Toni Basil** hit **Micky** and **Only You**, previously a hit for Yazoo. Described as a gem by one reviewer, it was a cover version of Russ Ballard's **I Wish Tonight Could Last Forever**. A follow-up album was planned but never released, and Leena would continue to perform through to 1995, when she gave up performing to raise her three children. In 2020 she became very ill and was admitted to a hospice. She died on September 7th, 2020.
