The songs have a great vibe, and something a little different for me. Pretty soon I'll be rehearsing with my band for the tour of Germany for late April and May. I'm really looking forward to it - My good friend Michael Voss will be supporting on the show. He's a great musician and has a great new album.

It's always a blast taking the stage with The Super Hippies (that's the name I've given my band...don't tell them, they don't know it yet 2. RUSS - LIFE STORIES

Margate - September 1964 - I remember the final night of our Margate season and saying our goodbyes to the cast and having a different feeling from the farewell from the year before at Bridlington. It was as if somehow I knew it would be the last one, or maybe, I was growing up. I felt I'd learned a lot about life in the last twelve months. We usually drove home from shows together - On this occasion I drove home alone and definitely had a melancholic feeling. It was the middle of September and the night was chilly. Also for much of the journey I was driving through patchy fog.

Chris Andrews was writing prolifically, and we recorded some more singles with Adam and although they made the charts, the positions were getting lower. Our record producer, John Burgess, suggested we make a 'Live' album, which indeed we did. The recording took place in Abbey Road studio number two. It was to be a fun night....A stage was erected at the far end of the studio and along with our amps and drums was an upright piano which Chris Andrews played as well as singing backing vocals with us. The audience came from the Adam Faith and the Roulettes fan club. We didn't actually record our usual stage show, instead, along with Adam's hit medley, we included 'Rockier' songs....'I Need Your Lovin' and a Ray Charles song "The Night Time is The Right Time'. Another song always enjoyable to play was a blues shuffle, called 'I Need Your Lovin' Everyday'. It was a fun night.

The album was called 'Faith Alive' and sold quite well....We sang 'I Need Your Loving' on a TV show a month or two after release of the album. The show was 'Ready Steady Live', It was the same show as 'Ready Steady Go', but the Producers decided the bands should play live instead of miming to records. On this particular show The Kinks were one of the 'Star' bands, along with an interview with John Lennon and George Harrison.....The director asked if we would close the show playing together with The Kinks.

After the transmission we were invited to the green room for drinks. When we arrived the Kinks were there along with John Lennon and George Harrison....They were both very friendly....I remember one comment that George made which surprised me. He thought the Beatle sound was as popular as it was because, "The rhythm guitar was so loud" _ I wonder?

Sue: Carole, who looks after Russ's Facebook page, and I were at the recording of "Faith Alive" at Abbey Road studios, along with our friends Jan and Sandra, who receive this newsletter. We were all very young, of

course. 😔 We reckon we were standing very close to each other but Carole and I didn't meet until 2012, when Russ introduced us at one of the Argent reunion gigs. Thanks to Carole for this photo she took after the recording.

Something more up-tempo this month, taken from a project that Christian Ballard was involved with back in 2005. I'm reminded of Hello, who were discovered by Roy Ballard in the early 1970s, and developed into a successful chart act by his younger brother Russell.

Hey Weirdo by The Gaff

Released on 2R Records in 2005, Hey Weirdo is a song recorded by Hertfordshire group The Gaff, formed in January 2002. They consisted of Matt Scales on vocals, Neil Jones on guitar, Leon Colven on bass and Rich Chambers on drums. The song, co-written by Russ, his son Christian, Andrew Murray and Matt Scales, raises the subject of not fitting in at school, and carries an anti-bullying message. A few words about Matt Scales. Matt grew up in Hoddesdon and suffered from Cystic Fibrosis, but steadfastly refused to let this hold him back from achieving his goals in life. Involved in local bands from an early age, Matt was a colourful and fun loving character, so much so that many people were unaware that he had the condition. Sadly, his life was cut short in April 2007, aged 28, as a result of an infection brought on by the disease. A talented songwriter, in both words and music, he was working on his first solo project at the time he became ill, cutting short what might have been a promising music career. His legacy includes a song called Breathe, which he wrote and performed at the Cystic Fibrosis Awards. Matt was always supportive of fellow sufferers of the disease. Hey Weirdo, is a fantastic song and crept just inside the Top 100 singles chart. Here is a link to the video: https://www.bandmine.com/mattscalesofficial/ videos/2/h5HTmerbExs

There is also footage of the actual making of the video, which took place at Parliament Hill School in Highgate, London.
