RUSS - LIFE STORIES

I'm Continuing my biog from my time with Unit Four Plus Two - Summer of 1968....The venue, Storyville Club Cologne, Germany.

We were into the second night of a fourteen night stay playing at The Storyville and, as I mentioned, we were on stage performing for two hours each night without a day off for voices to recover. We asked a young man, his name was 'Ziggy' how groups get through fourteen consecutive days without losing voices -Ziggy, with hesitation, said, "Go to The Apotek" [Pharmacy] and ask for Anine pills. We did wonder, what could these A.N. One pills contain to be so special? However, we were asked by the woman behind the counter...."Would you like 25, 50 or 100" - We thought, well six in the group, 14 nights...It must be at least 100....Then Buster said, he didn't want any drugs, then Pete Moules said, "I don't need them" that meant we only needed 50 pills...We decided to get 100 anyway!! Ziggy did say take them with beer [for full effect]...We did and they turned out to be very effective - However, amazing the way the stimulants could allow us to sing higher than we ever could sing before and also give us the most fantastic feeling of being 'High' in the end. When the drug started wear off, we felt a terrible 'Low'...Anyway, we stayed with our new agenda, pill taken each evening followed by a beer. It didn't take long to realise we'd need to add a pill and an extra pill and beer each night for the original feeling [This, by the way is something I don't recommend...now, I'm older and wiser}

After completing two nights, having sung 100 songs and consuming 32 Anine Pills and 40 beers, we decided to go to The Scotsmans Club, which was a short cab ride from The Storyville. We decided to do this after each performance, mainly because we'd only lay wide awake in bed feeling a bit miserable, from the residue of pills and beer.

Earlier this particular evening at The Storyville, a waiter stood in front of the stage as we played....he held a tray, on the tray was a whisky and a bottle of

coke. I could see he was trying to attract my attention. When we finished the song, he held the tray up to the stage and said...."Zer lady at Zer Bar". Half an hour earlier, I noticed a good looking young lady smiling in my direction while on the stage. I took the whisky and held it up and looked her way, she did the sameit was very James Bond... Now....back to the Scotsmans Club....as we sat [That's with Lem, Bob and Tom] drinking more beer....a waiter appeared next to me with a tray and Yes, a whisky and a coke. He gestured to a lady sitting at the bar....Indeed it was the lady who sent me the drinks earlier at the Storyville. I did attempt my 007 impression again, however, she just nodded and gave a look like...."You either invite me to your table, or, you're history, baby". Then our new Friend appeared at the table....his name was Willie - He told us the night before he had ladies working for him and this young lady was one. "She wants you man", Willie said. "She don't speak English". "Anyway" he went on...."She wants you to f..k her man and she'll pay you 500 marks, which then was 50 pounds. Remember, we were only earning 35 pounds each a week in Cologne.....Continued next month....That's enough excitement for now, haha....Lots of Love - Russ

COMING UP - BARNOLDSWICK






RIGHTS AND WRONGS

I've been seeing a lot of artists recently putting out anniversary albums and box sets celebrating their earlier works. I say "artists putting out", rather than "artists cashing in" because I think we all know that the original artists rarely receive any financial reward, and in some cases probably don't even get a say on what is released. A lot of these anniversary albums or box sets benefit from the addition of unreleased tracks, previously unheard live tracks, outtakes or album remixes. Those that take it seriously, Deep Purple being one, go the extra mile by providing extended sleeve notes, full replica of the original sleeve design, lyric sheet and even use the original vinyl record label design on the CD. As I write this, pre-orders are being taken for the forthcoming 50th anniversary re-issue of their Made in Japan live album. Fans still buy them, I still buy them, hoping to hear something I missed on earlier versions.

Argent fans have been treated to various compilations over the years, at least 15. Most of these have consisted of singles and fan favourites, some packaged with care and attention, others very badly. I cringe every time I see one in particular, Hold Your Head Up, a Sony release branded as being a Priceless Collection. The front cover boasts a photo of the Argent MkII line-Up, with John Grimaldi and John Verity, yet there isn't a single song on the CD that features this line-up. All the tracks feature the original line-up and Russ Ballard, who wrote 5 of the 10 songs, is nowhere to be seen. How could a company of Sony's standing be so negligent? (Note: I just had an embarrassing thought. My niece used to work for Sony in their promotions department. I hope she wasn't responsible). Seriously though, it isn't difficult to check these things. Henrit spelt with two T's is another error we often see. Fortunately, a later 2022 compilation under the

same title, was a much more professional job with quality photos and sleeve notes, but then I spotted that 4 of the tracks feature the MKII line up with John Verity and John Grimaldi getting only a cursory mention, and their 2nd album **Counterpoints** referred to as **Consequences**.

I often wish they'd seek expert help before releasing these compilations. Nobody knows better than the fans, and if I can spot a howler, think how many howlers can be picked up by sharper, more knowledgeable fans such as Roland Herzog, Steve Rossi and Eddy Bonte.

The best package of re-issues, for me at least, is the Original Album Classics, from CBS. This series featured a number of CBS / Epic artists, including Colin Blunstone as well as Argent, treating their fans to a pack of 3 or 5 classic LPs, each parcelled as a CD inside a CD sized replica of the original LP sleeve. So, in Argent's case, the LPs are Argent, Ring of Hands, All Together Now, In Deep and Nexus.

OK, no additional tracks, not even the previously released Closer to Heaven and Kingdom. Nevertheless, a nice compilation to have, except, you guessed it, the band on the front cover is the MkII line-up with the two Johns in the photograph but missing the guy in shades. And who was behind this release? Right again, Sony Music. Hard to believe. To go to all the trouble of re-creating all the original album sleeves, then box it into a package that has a photo of the wrong line-up.

However, I now discover that there is a second version of this package in circulation, and they, whoever 'they' are, has made amends by correcting the line-up on front cover.


The corrected sleeve version was apparently re-issued in 2023, manufactured in The Netherlands, so for anyone wishing to fill in any gaps in their Argent collection, you might still find this.

Both releases feature the US Nexus sleeve, rather than the UK, Europe and Japan design. I wonder why they chose two designs. Another story for another day!

Wow, its all about legends this month, the 'real' one being the composer of this song, **Russ Ballard** of course.






I Will be There by Gogmagog

Gogmagog was a short lived English heavy metal supergroup put together by record producer **Jonathan King** and made up of former members of **Iron Maiden**, **Gillan**, **Def Leppard** and **Whitesnake**. Released in 1985, this 3-song EP featured a cover of Russ Ballard's **I Will Be There**, originally featured on Russ's 1981 **Into the Fire album**, and a song that many newsletter readers count as one of their favourite Ballard songs, me included. We won't talk about the other two songs tucked away on the other side. Both Jonathan King compositions, their titles speak for themselves.

King originally planned to base the group around ex **Deep Purple** singer **David Coverdale**, **Who** bass guitarist **John Entwistle** and ex **Rainbow** drummer **Cozy Powell**. Cozy said he thought the Russ Ballard song was "the best he's ever written", amazing considering he was not very enthusiastic about Rainbow recording **Since You Been Gone**. Entwistle was excited about being involved, but things didn't work out, and a new line-up was formed featuring **Paul Di'Anno** (lead vocals), **Janick Gers** and **Pete Willis** (guitars), **Neil Murray** (bass) and **Clive Burr** (drums). They only recorded this one EP.
Burr later developed MS from which he died in 2013. Di'Anno passed away in October 2024 aged 66.
